10 MAY 1932

12 MAY 1932

Lieut Chavarria and ten enlisted returned Esteli from police mission. Captured three prisoners and one skot gun.

Lieut Stanko and eight enlisted cleared Palacaguina on police mission. Returned. Nothing to report.

Lieut Burt and fifteen enlisted cleared Ocotal for Pueblo Nuevo. Arrived.

Lieuts Beans, Oszkowicz (R) and Smith (R) and eighteen enlisted arrived Telpaneca from Ocotal.

Map. First contact started at 0900 and lasted one hour, second one started 1300 and lasted five minutes. Bandit casualties unknown but indication of several wounded. No Guardia casualties. Captured seventeen animals, small amount of ammunition and correspondence.

Colonel Julian C. Smith, Director of Operations, G.N., and Captain Bales, Law Officer, G.N., arrived Leon from Managua.

14 Civicos called into service in Leon to augment Guardia garrison, used as Guard at Bank, Transformer Station and mounted patrols on outskirts of city.

7 Auxiliares, cleared Sauce for Somotillo via Villa Nueva for duty.

Lieut Atwell, 7 enlisted and 5 Auxiliares cleared El Sauce for Achuapa.

Lieut Hamas and sixteen enlisted arrived Jicaro from Apali.

Lieut Lopez and ten enlisted arrived Condega from Pueblo Nuevo.

Capt Williams and nine enlisted cleared Somoto on reconnaissance mission.

Lieuts Price and Lopez and twenty five enlisted cleared Condega on combat mission.

Lieuts Berueffy, Wallace and Aleman and four enlisted cleared Ocotal for Lanagua by plane.

Lieuts Price and Lopez and twenty five enlisted arrived Palacaguina.

Lieuts Price and Stanko and twenty five enlisted cleared Palacaguina on combat mission.

Lieuts Hays and Gutierrez and fifteen enlisted arrived San Juan from Quilali.

lst Sgt Solorzano and seventeen other enlisted cleared Apali for halfway to Jicaro.

Lieut Gutierrez and sixteen enlisted cleared Jicaro for half way to Apali.

Lieut Gutierrez P. with sixteen enlisted returned Jinotega from half way Matagalpa.

Lieut Castillo with fifteen enlisted cleared La Concordia on reconnaissance patrol.

Lieut Castillo with fifteen enlisted returned La Concordia from San Jose, Las Orquetas, El Llano y Coyolito, Zapote, Bramadero, Exique. Had contact in Bramadero with group of sixty, jefe believed Socrates Sandino or Carlos Salgado. Contact lasted one hour. No Guardia casualties, several bandits believed wounded. Bandits dispersed all directions. Had second contact lasting about five minutes with same group at 1:00 PM near Zapote. Bandits dispersed, no Guardia casualties and believe bandits suffered other wounded. Guardia captured seventeen horses with full equipment, personal baggage including correspondence, six cartridge Kraß Rifles, one red flag, red and black hat bands, also burned quantity of food supplies in two houses used as bandit camp.

Guardia La Ceiba reports: - That Sunday morning 15 May, 3 miles East La Ceiba, they ran into 15 men armed with rifles, shotguns and machettes playing dice. When they saw the Guardia they opened fire. Guardia returned fire, group scattered, leaving behing 4 machetes, 2 hats, one of which is Guardia hat, one blanket. Casualties unknown but several trais of blood

left. Captured one prisoner, shortly afterwards who is suspected as being one of the group.

3. Contact was made with the main camp of SANDINO

about 1600 26 Apr 32, SOUTH EAST of GUAMBUCO MOUNTAIN. Patrol was proceeding slightly down hill thru thick pine growth and light brush when the point observed a cleared space about 560 yards long and ranging from 125 to 250 yards wide. Patrol halted and on closer observation a house was seen nearly in the center of the clearing and a man was seen on the west side of the house chopping wood. The point advanced taking advantage of all possible cover. trail led just inside the fringe of pines on the clearing. When directly west of the house previously mentioned the point emerged into the open and the main camp, consisting of some 30 well constructed grass houses, was seen about 150 yards east of the place where the point came out. Advance was made as fast as possible on these houses, the men having to crawl over and under and thru trees which had been felled in every which direction and manner to impede just such an advance as ours.

During the advance of the point the men seen near the house in the clearing had entered same, seemingly not knowing that we were anywhere near. When the first men of the main body were opposite this house, two (2) men, one (1) with Sub-Thompson were sent to get him. When they arrived he ran and was shot down by the Sub-T. Immediately the bandits opened fire on point and main body. This fire was heavy. well directed and several automatic weapons were being used, also rifle grenades and hand bombs, thrown with a sling. Bandits firing line at this time was about 200 yards long, with its right extremity north-east by east of the first men Range was about 150 yards with the bandit in the point. position slightly higher than that occupied by the Guardia, but with little or no prepared protection, firing coming from behing trees, rocks, over the ridge, etc. As firing opened, the men of the point dropped and took positions behind the well prepared fortifications the bandits had built at their camp. Those men following the point took up positions behind trees, rocks, etc.

Heavy firing continued for about forty-five minutes, when practically all bandit firing ceased. Cuardia firing continued but was light, only an occasional shot from various points along the line.

About ten minutes later bandits opened with heavy fire and it was noted that their firing line had been extended to the SCUTH and that it was now over five hundred yards long and increasing. Lieut VOGEL with four automatic weapons was immediately sent to check this movement of their left flank and did so very successfully, the bandit firing line thereafter gradually diminishing to the north.

Bandits seemed to be retreating along a ridge to the northwest and Lieut BURNS and GUTIERREZ with two automatic weapons were sent to cut them off. Due to the nature of the terrain, heavy brush and coming of darkness this movement

could not be completed.

Firing continued until dark, bandits gradually

retreating to the northwest.

Tomen and children were present and evidently took part in the fight. Their voices were plainly recognizable. During the fighting the bandits "vivaed" SANDINO,

General GARCIA (Quilali) and Capitan CORNEJO (Quilali).

Excellent shooting was done by the bandits, shot after shot being put in almost the same place. This was especially noted in the prepared position occupied by the Guardia. Their placing of rifle grenades was very good, several exploding on the line occupied by the Guardia.

It is believed that the bandits in the camp saw the patrol coming and that the man shot near the house was used as a decoy to delay the advance of the patrol and to lend a seeming innocense to the camp, thereby giving those in the main camp time to evacuate with all belongings. (Main camp was not visible until point was some 125 yards from it). It is further believed that the bandits had prepared everything for a quick evacuation, and that they had been expecting a Guardia patrol since SALGADO's camp was destroyed on 23 Apr 32. It is estimated there were between 250 and 300 bandits in this camp.

SANDINO was personally directing the fight for his voice was recognized by a civilian, TEODORO the bandits. HERRERA, who had known SANDINO since SANDINO was a small boy. The voice of Corporal CORNEJO, deserter Quilali, was also re-

cognized.

- It is estimated the bandits used five to eight automatic weapons, LEWIS, BAR and SUB-THOMPSON; at least two rifle grenade dischargers; SPRINGFIELD 1903 rifles; KRAG rifles, PISTOLS and NATIVE BOMBS. Guardia used three BARS, five SUB-Ts, three rifle grenade dischargers, SPRINGFIEL D 1903 rifles, KRAG rifles.
 - 6. Casualties were as follows:

Bandits killed - - - - - - - 10 wounded - - - - - - 21 (estimated)

Guardia killed - - - - - - - wounded -----1 (slightly)

7. Articles captured were:-

6 Rifles, little or no value, destroyed.

3 Drums, Sub-T w/amnunition.

Bandit camp, 5 main houses, 30 leantos, all well constructed with sides, built in beds, etc, destroyed by fire.

- 8. No Guardia property was lost during contact.
- 9. The patrol leader takes great pleasure in recommending the following officers and enlisted men for commendation, and for award of appropriate decorations for services rendered:

Lieut JOHN A BURMS for his bravery, excellent courage and good judgement during attack of SAUDINO's main camp and holding left flank during heavy three (5) hours fighting.

Lieut ROY E VOGEL for bravery, excellenty judge-ment, holding and fighting from right flank during heavy firing.

Lieut Luis E GUTIERREZ for bravery displayed during heavy enemy fire.

Lieut FEDERICO CABRERA for his splendid courage shown disregarding personal safety as liaison officer under heavy fire.

Sergeant TEOFILO AGUILAR, #1040, for great courage and strict obedience of orders under heavy fire.

Raso MIGUEL RIOS, #4913, for bravery under heavy enemy fire.

Raso ISIDRO VASQUEZ, #1850, for his fortitude, great courage and devotion to duty while protecting main body of troops on right flank while enemy attempted to flank us and effective use of Sub-T machine gun.

- 10. The conduct and splendid voluntary spirit of all members of the patrol was excellent and all are worthy of the highest praise.
- 11. The patrol returned to Apali at 1000 28 Apr 52, with one slightly wounded member of the patrol

- In accordance with the reference, a patrol consisting of two (2) officers and thirty five (35) enlisted men, cleared APALI at 1520 1 MAY 32, for LA CUYA, on information furnished by a civilian, that there was a bandit group camped near that place.

group at 1700 l MAY 32. Fighting lasted for about twenty five (25) minutes, when bandits were driven from their position.

The guide warned the patrol that we were nearing the place where he had seen the bandits in the morning about one half mile from where they were encountered. The patrol proceeded cautiously and the point was fired on when it was on the ridge of a hill about one hundred fifty (150) yards from bandit camp. Point took cover behind trees and returned fire. The main body came up on a hill to the left of and higher than the hill occupied by the point and directed its fire on the

hill occupied by the enemy, taking cover behind rocks, trees, etc.

The hill occupied by the bandits was high er than the positions of the point and main body of the Guardia, and was across a ravine. This ravine was clean, there was no brush to cover an advance and there were very few trees. The sides of the hill were very steep, about 35 to 40 degrees, and clean.

The bandits could be seen in their position and well aimed fire was directed at these known positions by the

point and main body.

One (1) man was seen in a tree. The patrol commander took a BAR and after a few shots he(the bandit) was seen to fall from the tree, without doubt dead.

when bandits ceased firing, the main body advanced to the position held by the point, and the point, covered by the main body, rushed the hill and took same without receiving any fire, the bandits having fled down the SUTH side of the hill and into a creek bottom which concealed their movements. A few minutes later two (2) were seen crossing a cleared spot about three thousand (3000) yards away and going in a southerly direction.

After the beginning of the fight two (2) men were wounded, one by a grenade fragment and the other by a cartridge ball. Raso FRANCISCO MARTINEZ, #3615, was wounded seriously in the left hand by rifle grenade. Raso GABRIEL ALTA-MIRANO, #3937, in the left forearm by a cartridge ball, which lodged in his arm.

The bandits did no say one word during the contact that could be heard in our position.

- 4. The bandits used one (1) and possibly two (2) automatic weapons, LEWIS and BAR or both BARS, Rifle Grenades, native BOMBS, large, SPRINGFIELD 1903 Rifles, KRAG rifles and miscellaneous other rifles. The Guardia used two (2) BARS, three (3) SUB-T, two (2) rifle grenade dischargers and KRAG rifles.
 - 5. Casualties were:-

Bandits killed - - - - - - - 1

wounded - - - - - 4 (estimated from signs)

Guardia killed - - - - - - 0

wounded - - - - 2

6. Articles captured were:-

Correspondence.
Bandit camp, 2 leantos, destroyed.

- 7. This bandit camp was temporary and was about three (3) to five (5) days old. No preparations had been made by the group to remain in this position any length of time.
- 8. The following officer and enlisted men are recommended for commendation:-

Second Lieut LUIS E GUTIERREZ for his leadership, coolness under fire and fighting example set for his men. Sergeant TEOFILO AGUILAR, $\frac{4}{5}$ 1048, for strict and immediate obedience of orders, coolness and bravery in forming liason with the point and main body when he had to expose himself to direct enemy fire to accomplish same.

Raso FRANCISCO MARTIMEZ, 73615, for his placing of rifle grenades, bravery in exposing himself to enemy fire to fire same, and later when wounded, altho suffering greatly, made no complaint, conducting himself in a superb manner, there by setting an example for his comrades.

- 9. The conduct, immediate compliance of orders, spirit and eagerness of the whole patrol to participate in the encounter was most noteworthy and it is recommended that each and every man of the patrol be cited in general orders. This contact was the third major contact, more two minor contacts, participated in by nearly all members of the patrol in the last ten (10) days.
- 10. The patrol returned to APALI at 2130 1 MAY 52, bandits not being pursued due to coming of darkness and the condition of the wounded men.

1. At 0600 13 May,1932, I cleared with a patrol of 15 enlisted to reconnciter vicinity south of the town. The events which ocurred "during the patrol are as follows:-

San Jose, Las Orquetas and arrived at Bramadero Mountain at 9:30. At this place we saw a bandit group that was crossing a pasture. My patrol opened fire against them. They answered our fire. After fifteen minutes fight we arrived at the first line which was accupied by the bandits, bandits gathered together on a high mountain. They "vivaed" Sandino, Salgado and Frias and invited us to climb up the hill. Later we were attacked on one flank, the bandits who were at the hill were saying: "Attack those bandit venders from behind", we were warned and avoided the attack from behind, driving back the bandits before they could occupy a position, at this time hand bombs discharged against them made the bandits retreat. Bandits fled in all directions and we were able to explore the camp.

1130 Cleared Branadero for Colon, then for Exiqui, no information could be obtained there, we continued to surround Bramadero mountain in a space of about one half league arriving to Zapote where we found some bandits, opened fire against them, for about five minutes, this happened at 1300, bandits dispersed leaving many blood trails and packs.

- 2. Hotwithstanding the fact that enemy was stronger than us, all of my men showed excellent conduct and discipline.
- 3. Arms used by the bandits: one automatic machine gun, rifles, pistols and dynamite bombs.

 Arms used by the Guardia were; one B.A.R., one STAG, one grenade discharger, 12 KraG Rifles and one .38 pistol.
- 4. Articles captured to the bandits: 17 animals, 15 saddles with their correspondent equipment, twelve packs containing all kinds of clothes, two hats, red and black hat bands, one red flag, six first class Krag cartridges, bearings for dynamite bombs, correspondence, one rain cout and medicines.
